Notes

It is **mandatory** for all Contractors to complete the Aurizon General Contractor Induction and to have the relevant Role for working in or around Aurizon's Rail Corridor.

If you are a **Visitor** to the Corridor (ie a person not undertaking any task or work activity as defined by the Aurizon Network Rail Corridor Safety Standard), you are not required to hold an 'Around the Track Personnel' Rail Safety Worker Role. Visitors that do not hold the Safely Access the Rail Corridor competency must be provided with a Rail Corridor Induction Checklist (SW 62) by an Aurizon Representative prior to accessing or upon entry the Rail Corridor. All visitors attending the Rail Corridor are to be given a pre-start briefing and are to be escorted at all times by an Aurizon Representative.

Aurizon - Network - Around the Track Personnel is the Role applicable to all Workers who work within Aurizon Network's Rail Corridor with exception to those areas defined under Rail Interfaces in the Aurizon Network Rail Corridor Safety Standard.

Aurizon - Network - Outside Rail Corridor Personnel is the Role applicable to Workers who undertake Rail Safety Work at locations outside of the Aurizon Network's Rail Corridor (e.g. Telecommunications equipment or Tower Structure on a mountain).

Aurizon - Network - Greenfield Construction sites are not connected to existing infrastructure. Once a Greenfield Construction site has rail on sleepers and/or is connected to existing infrastructure, the Aurizon - Network - Around the Track Personnel Role is required.

An **Aurizon - Network - Responsible Worker** is defined as per the Aurizon Rail Corridor Safety Standard which is available via the Aurizon - External Workers Safety, Health and Environment Documents Advices and Alerts Portal. Aurizon - Network Lookout (Non-Protection Officer) - A Protection Officer will make the decision whether lookout working is the acceptable method for the task and will instruct the Lookout on their duties.

Aurizon issued Track Protection cards must be available for presentation at all times on site.

X\$ Category 3 Medicals will be replaced with Category 2 Medicals (minimum) for specific Roles from 1 September 2024. Existing Protection Officers and Lookout Roleholders will be able to upload new Category 2 Medicals to their Profile from 28 August 2023 until 31 August 2024.

* Rail Corridor Safety Standard Upskilling v1.1 to v1.2 Certificate or Aurizon Rail Corridor Induction Certificate dated after 30 April 2022.
